**Lecture Topic: Indigenous literacy: the key to self-determination.**

Dr Anita Heiss will take the Albury-Wodonga community on a journey through her own educational history from the impacts of being the only Koori kid at private school to becoming the first Aboriginal student to graduate with a PhD from UWS. Anita will consider the education system from the perspective of student and teacher, as her journey includes lecturing on Indigenous Studies in Australia and abroad and working on the ground with Aboriginal students in urban and remote areas of Australia. As an Indigenous Literacy Ambassador Anita will discuss the key ingredient missing in the education system which could easily ensure a fair and equitable life experience for her people.
